# Halfway There!

## World Congress Puebla

We are almost midway until the next World Congress and many members are starting to plan and save up to come to the historic city of Puebla in Central Mexico. Earlier this year, Maya Korzybska (WSA Vice Chair and World Congress coordinator) had a three week working trip to the city. She was joined by Marston Gregory from the US for part of her stay.

Maya’s visit was filled with meetings with tourism officials, government officials, hotel and restaurant representatives, artisan associations and travel agents. She toured the congress sites, making sure the facilities that were available meet the WSA, the affiliates and the Subud members needs for a World Congress.

The main World Congress site is the Centro de Convenciones de Puebla, which is just across from the Centro Historico, a UNESCO World Heritage site. Maya found that the basic needs of the World Congress have been addressed, including spaces for ongoing latihan and kejiwaan activities, plenary sessions and major performances. Spaces for the wings were also reviewed and negotiations for further spaces for youth, children, sports and workshops were begun. One of our great assets will be the use of the 1000 square meter Museum and Exhibition Centre of

Contemporary Art, which is literally next door to the Convention Centre, where SICA will have its base.

Maya visited some 40 hotels during her stay. The hotels closest to the Convention Centre also provide a number of meeting rooms.

### MONEY, MONEY, MONEY

Financially, apart from the registration fee which we hope will be lower than previous congresses, meals in Puebla cost between 4 to 11 dollars for all tastes and styles, as well as, of course more expensive up market restaurants. Hotels also offer a large variety of standards, quality and pricing from back packers to 5 stars. Maya said she feels confident that member’s budgets will allow them to access hotels of a better standard than usual and get more for their money!

One of the reasons we hope to be able to have a lower registration fee is due to the fact that we are eligible for Tax Exempt Status in Mexico which means 0% GST/ VAT/IVA...on most of our larger payments. This will give us a saving of 16% on those payments. We are aiming to make a congress that will be financially accessible to as many members as possible. More information on this will be forthcoming.

### GOING GREEN

It has been agreed that we shall do our utmost to make our congress as green and socially friendly as possible, using fair trading partners, interacting with local NGO's and charities, focusing and promoting the hotels that have green and eco-friendly policies as well as using eco-friendly suppliers. ### THE CONGRESS TEAM

WCOT (World Congress Organizing Committee) is growing and as agreed in New Zealand, includes members from all across Zone 7.

WCOT began with Fernando Fatah as chair, Arif Rivero as vice chair, Stella Jassan for on-site finances and Maya Korzybska representing WSA, it has now expanded to include, Ezequiel Chavez (Mexico) IT and website, Marston Gregory (USA) for income financial management (as registration fees will go directly to the WSA account in the US). Lucida Graneau and Maemunah Doran (Canada) will be handling the on-line registration system. Latest addition is Debbie Machado (originally from Venezuela) who speaks 4 languages has volunteered to be the Customers Service person for all questions regarding registration. These three ladies are all highly qualified for these jobs.

Rasjidah Flores in Mexico, personally and on behalf of SDIA will be the coordinator for 'greening the congress' and making it socially friendly. Maemunah Flores has accepted the role of developing commercial partnerships and advertising, to be able to (discreetly) reduce the costs of our congress and thus allow us to 'spend more' on activities. Others have offered to take on roles and will come on board as the development requires it. The team is supported by local helpers as well as the International Helpers of Area 3.

### AND THERE'S MORE....

The scheduled dates for the congress are 2nd to 17th of August 2014, though this will be finalized at the WSC meeting in Vancouver. The dates are after Ramadan and during the holiday season for a large number, if not all, countries.

The launching of the World Congress Logo Competition began in February, this is still open. The final choice will be made in June at the council meeting and the prize will be a free registration to Congress. Finally we hope to have the on-line registration open in January 2013 with early bird rates and other payment facilities.

# Aftershocks

## Update on Christchurch

“

I drove into the battered centre of Christchurch the other day and got totally lost. I “knew” where I was, but the lack of familiar landmarks was disorienting. I was not lost for long but the effect was momentarily unsettling - like the little cousin of madness when words might lose their meaning or familiar faces their identity...

We have been shaken 10,000 times and it is still going on. We hope that the decreasing intensity of the aftershocks will abate, but scientists advise this is a geological event that may take 40 years to play out. As time goes by, another really destructive quake is statistically less likely, but no one is saying it won't happen.

### OUR SUBUD HOUSE

Our two halls and the old Subud House are damaged but still standing and still serviceable in spite of the continuing incremental damage from thousands of aftershocks. Insurance should eventually bring repairs close to the condition the property was in before the earthquakes. This is the tricky one, because to be compliant with the new post-quake building code we ourselves will have to fund the difference between the way the buildings were and the way they should be under the new code. Thanks to the generous support

from the brotherhood our Earthquake Emergency Fund still has money which we use to support members needing help and intend to use to repair our halls up to the new standard.

### SUBUD MEMBERS

It is not easy. The members, like the buildings, are mostly still standing. This damage is real. Now, 18 months on, serious neurological conditions have cropped up amongst us. Is this earthquake related? We feel it must be.

We witnessed something massive and awful here that shook up our world. As a group we probably still have the same problems as many other groups, but this act of witness has opened our eyes a little and we are more grateful than ever to be here and for what we have received.

**The Muhammad Subuh Foundation (MSF) is a non-profit foundation that supports the development of Subud and long-term goals of the World Subud Association.**

MSF will be launching a major fundraising drive dubbed “The Legacy Project” at the Americas Gathering this year in an effort to raise funds to preserve the talks of Bapak. A recent technical review of audio samples by experts in Belgium found that a number of recordings were in urgent need of restoration, and that’s just the beginning.

As the audio tapes are processed, it is likely that they will find that some will need more work than others. In addition, there are thousands upon thousands of original documents, videos and films that need to be preserved, catalogued, and organized, including the video talks of Bapak and Ibu Siti Rahayu.

So the need for taking steps now to preserve the words of Bapak for all of humanity is an urgent one. Recently, the WSA fundraiser, Stuart Cooke, joined Hannah Baerveldt, MSF trustee to support this campaign.

“I am so pleased that Stuart Cooke, the WSA fundraiser, has agreed to serve as deputy chair of The Legacy Project lead committee. This archives fundraising drive is so important for Subud’s development, and a close-working relationship between the Muhammad Subuh Foundation and the World Subud Association is absolutely essential to achieve our mutual objective: to provide for the long term preservation of the WSA Archives, and particularly the sound recordings which are currently at risk.” Hannah Baerveldt.

The council's intention is not to deplete our reserve, but rather to build it up, to be able in the future to invest in important programs.

We have an ambitious WSA Archives program for 2012...to professionally restore and archive the originally audio recordings of Bapak talks's. This is an expensive, ongoing project, being spearheaded by MSF (Muhammad Subuh Foundation) on behalf of WSA, and thus all of us. A full WSA Archive program is being prepared which will need substantial funding over the coming years (see MSF section).

The challenge to the other Subud enterprises out there run by Subud members worldwide is (in the words of a great leader) - **"ask not what Subud can do for you... ask what you can do for Subud"**.

We pray that further Subud enterprises worldwide will now also rise to the challenge, and actively support our Subud organization.

The WSA 2011 audit is booked to start on 1 May 2012 with completion

by 15 May 2012. While, the MSF audit work is now complete - These are currently being approved and signed off.

## **SUBUD Registered in the USA**

After six years to the day (April 4th 2006) and on the third attempt WSA has finally managed to register SUBUD in the USA in 5 main categories. This has been quite a saga and will write more about in the next WSA newsletter

All activities of the WSA and its affiliates are there to support the spiritual practice we call the latihan. Examples of the activities have already been published in the 'What we Do and How we do it paper' published by the WSA Executive in 2010. For Subud members and members of the WSA, we thought it might be interesting to include in this newsletter the AIMS of the WSA as they appear on our by laws, as a reminder. More information about WSA can be found on [www.subud.org](http://www.subud.org).

The World Subud Association is the umbrella organization for the world wide Subud community, which includes 54 member countries and Subud presence in 32 more. Thus there are Subud members in 86 countries world wide.

## **01.**

To facilitate the worship of Almighty God through the Latihan Kejiwaan of Subud and to provide for the other needs of the Subud membership.

## **02.**

To preserve the practice of the Latihan Kejiwaan so that it will remain available to people everywhere in the form in which it was originally practiced under the guidance of Muhammad Subuh Sumohadiwidjojo.

## **03.**

To protect the good reputation of Subud.

## **04.**

To encourage peace, harmony and understanding between peoples regardless of their ethnic origin or religion.

## **05.**

To provide educational and other facilities for the development of the full potential of human beings.

## **06.**

To relieve poverty and deprivation.

## **07.**

To encourage the development of a healthy and harmonious inner and outer environment for the well-being of mankind.

## **08.**

To encourage cultural activities and the values which enliven and enrich the human spirit.

## **09.**

To encourage the entrepreneurial spirit which enables people to express their true talents and develop the capacity to improve the quality of their lives.

## **10.**

To make available information concerning the Latihan Kejiwaan of Subud.
